

## TOM JOYCE AFTERSHOCK

an exhibition of sculpture | drawings | photographs | video

AUGUST 7 THROUGH OCTOBER 3, 2015



Referring to geologic forces felt but unseen,
Aftershock illustrates Tom Joyce's ongoing
explorations into the natural and industrially
manufactured worlds of iron. Acknowledging iron's
indispensable role played in both minute and
magnificent proportions – from iron atoms in blood
to earth's molten iron core – the sculptures, charred
drawings, transparent images and video presented
address inherent properties found in the artist's
material of choice.

Originally trained as a blacksmith, Joyce is widely acknowledged as one of the foremost practitioners in the field for his contributions to the art and science of forging iron. Awarded a MacArthur Foundation Fellowship in 2003; Joyce was inducted into the Smithsonian Institution's Archives of American Art in 2004; was honored with a Governor's Award for Excellence in the Arts in 2009; received a United States Artists Windgate Fellowship in 2011; and was given an honorary doctorate from the Santa Fe University of Art and Design in 2014.

Exhibiting internationally since 1981, Joyce's work can be found in many public collections, including Smithsonian Institution's Renwick Gallery; Minneapolis Institute of Art; Detroit Institute of Art; Luce Foundation's Center for American Art; Boston Museum of Fine Art; and Yale University Art Gallery.

Recent public commissions include seven forged sculptures permanently installed on Broadway and Columbus Circle at the Museum of Arts and Design (NYC, 2014); a 30 m long quote by Virgil forged from recovered World Trade Center steel for the National September 11 Memorial Museum (NYC, 2014); and to be dedicated in October at the Mint Museum of Art (Charlotte, NC, 2015), a stainless steel and cast iron sculpture that brings to completion "Project Ten Ten Ten", a series of 10 major works commissioned from leading international artists and designers in celebration of the museum's opening in 2010.









PENUMBRA XIV | 2015, charred wood fiber, 48.5 x 48.5 x 3 inches












CORONA I | 2015, illuminated digital chromogenic FujiTrans, 25 x 25 x 4 inches


